New year, new budget

Thank you to all MGs who continue to answer the annual appeal letter. We've exceeded our goal and are approaching last year's total. Although we won't have year-end figures for a while, the success of the plant sale, notecards, golf tournament, harvest dinner, as well as the appeal letter all contributed to another vear of growing-quite achievement in our national economy.

This year we're expecting to run a deficit due to the almost constantly shifting budget situation at WSU and in the state. Increasing costs are everywhere in the Foundation budget from parking and room rentals at CUH to personnel costs. MGs in King County have the luxury of some cash reserves so our program is in no immediate danger of being eliminated.

The board will be spending its time and energy strategizing how our programs can continue as the WSU budget is cut further and further. For 2011, however, all garden and clinic budgets were frozen at last year's levels. As the face of our public outreach efforts, the board felt it critical to continue to invest in what we do effectively throughout the county. We've already begun efforts to evaluate our programs and projects to ensure we're spending our money wisely. Have ideas? Please contact a board member, or attend a board meeting the second Thursday of the month from 6:30-8:30, typically at CUH.

MGFKC 2011 Budget Approved

At the November 11, 2010 meeting, the board of the Master Gardeners Foundation of King County approved a budget for 2011. Expenses of \$86,270 were approved with an estimated \$16,745 deficit. Without King County support and with WSU constraints, this budget supports Elaine and her assistant Karen with salary funds. Support to gardens and clinics has not been reduced.
