Super Fantastic	Red	2"	Round	70	I	Better than Fantastic, disease resistant
Yellow Pear	Yellow	2"	Pear	78	I	Vigorous vines, dependable heirloom
LARGE FRUIT						
Beefsteak	Red	4"	Squat	75	I	Large and juicy
Black Krim	Deep Red	4"	Oblong	75	I	Heirloom from Crimea, slightly salty
Brandywine	Red	4"	Oblong	90	I	Amish heirloom
Bush Early Girl	Red	4"	Round	65	D	18' compact plant
Early Girl	Red	3"	Round	60	I	Well known, good for salads
Mortgage Lifter	Red	3"	Round	75	I	Meaty heirloom, a.k.a. Radiator Charlie
Old German	Yellow Red	3"	Oblong	75	I	Heirloom good for slicing or canning

* Days = Days from planting until mature fruits

** D-Determinate (Fixed size, produces crop all at same time, good for container or small areas)

I- Indeterminate (Continues growing and producing all summer, needs staking or caging)

Basic Planting Instructions:

- 1) Don't plant outside until mid-May to prevent frost damage.
- 2) Pinch off leaves on bottom half of stem before transplanting.
- 3) Bury up to one half of stem underground to help rooting.
- 4) Stake or cage as necessary to prevent plant from falling over.
