Through this program we hope to foster innovation and creativity, stimulate problem solving and creative solutions, encourage a sense of unity and community among all Master Gardeners in our state, and to make possible programs that otherwise might struggle or never be able to progress beyond the planning stage.

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Guidelines for Applications

1. Application is open to all non-urban county Master Gardener programs. (Clark, Kitsap, Pierce, Snohomish and Spokane counties are not eligible; it is our thought that resources are more readily available in the more populated counties.)
2. Only Washington State University Master Gardener sponsored and administered programs are eligible for consideration.
3. Up to \$1,500 is available annually; one county may receive the entire amount, or it may be shared between two, depending on the needs described in the applications received.
4. Applications must be received by July 1. Grants for the following year will be announced at the September annual state Master Gardener conference.
5. A committee of four members, two designated by the Board of the King County Master Gardener Foundation and two designated by the Board of the Washington State Master Gardener Foundation, shall review the applications.
6. If a majority of that group does not agree upon the successful application(s), the final decision shall be made by the Board of the Master Gardeners Foundation of King County.
7. These grants are for one time only, and cannot be renewed.
8. Recipient counties are eligible to re-apply for a new project three years after a grant has been awarded and completed.
9. Operating expenses and funding are eligible, but start-up and/or expansion funds for new and/or innovative programs shall be favored.
10. Project-end reports should be sent jointly to the State Master Gardener Foundation and the King County Master Gardener Foundation, and each county receiving this grant is encouraged to use every means available (the State Foundation Newsletter and state conference meetings, for example) to share their experiences, outcomes and ideas with other Master Gardeners and Master Gardener organizations.

11. The Project Leader must be a WSU Master Gardener, County Agent or Master Gardener Coordinator and identified on each application, and each application must be signed by three volunteers (all Master Gardeners) as well as by the WSU Program Coordinator or County Extension Agent.

12. Joint programs with other county, state or non-profit organizations and/or groups are eligible, but financial control of the granted funds must remain with the Master Gardener county organization or office.
