

**Gardener Program Internship** Requirements

After careful consideration, we've decided to make some changes to our King County internship requirements beginning in 2018. We looked at other counties and discovered that most have a one-year internship. WSU has set the statewide minimum internship to be 40 hours completed within a year of training although individual counties may require additional hours. Our internship program will now be one year in length and require 40 hours, including 5 clinic shifts and 3 garden shifts. These changes will bring our requirements in line with other counties, and we hope that the changes appeal to potential Master Gardeners that are still working, raising families or juggling other responsibilities. We congratulate all our current first-year interns and our second-year interns who've completed their required hours for 2017 and will become veterans on January 1st, 2018!
