### ***Master Gardener Diagnostics Lab: Problem Solvers Extraordinaire***

This is a shout-out to the Master Gardeners who serve as the King County Diagnostics Lab. Led by Elaine Sherbrooke, this group of trained diagnosticians is here to support our plant clinics by identifying plant problems and recommending solutions for King County residents.

Each year, the Lab analyzes over 400 samples. They



are able to diagnose most of the problems, sending the unknowns to the WSU lab in Puyallup for a final resolution. The King County Diagnostics Lab is unique in the state and funded through the Master Gardener Foundation of King County with no financial support from WSU Extension.

Most importantly, the Diagnostics Lab spends two days with each year's intern class: one day with hands-on diagnostic training, and a second session during training to identify and report back to the class on the "Stump the Diagnostician" samples they provide.

Lastly, there is *Heads UP!*, the newsletter published by the Lab with seasonal information and tips during the growing season from March through October. This newsletter helps diagnosticians share their accumulated knowledge with the community.

You have a role in this, too. Submitting samples as requested extends their viability until the Lab receives the sample. Providing the necessary information in the diagnosis and/or ID forms as legibly and completely as possible gives the diagnosticians the details they need. Be sure your clinic name is included so the Lab can share their findings with the clinic as well as the client. Thank you for doing your part to help the diagnosticians. 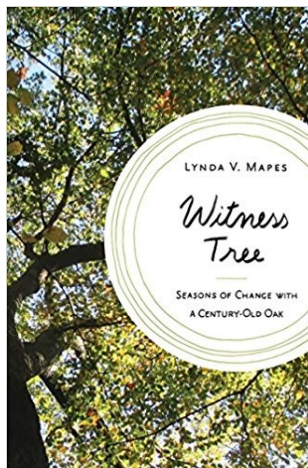

Mark your calendars for Saturday, September 22. The September event at the BBG welcomes Christina Pfeiffer and Bill Thorness -- both well-known authors and successful speakers. Bill will be speaking at 12:30 p.m. on winter gardening, and selecting and planting vegetable starts, followed by winter soil-building, using cover crops and pointing out the different contributions each seed makes to the soil. He will finish with a talk on early planning for 2019. This is a great idea and one that I almost always leave too late.

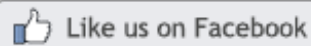
